Purpose of data processing

We collect your personal data for the processing and transmission of data for the organisation and administration of the GEO Day and online GEO Day.

GEO Day is the open day of the Department of Geodesy and Geoinformation.

On the online GEO Day, lectures are offered for school classes, which are then presented live via Zoom.

Legal basis of the data processing

This use of personal data is based on Article 6 par 1 (e) GDPR (performance of a task in the public interest) in conjunction with § 3 Austrian Universities Act 2002 and regarding photos / videos and information about events on the basis of Article 6 par 1 (a) GDPR (consent).

Categories of recipients of personal data

No data will be transferred to third parties.

Pictures/videos on GEO Day

Pictures will be taken and videos recorded within the framework of the event, for which we require your consent. The pictures and videos will be used for marketing purposes (event reports, promotion of follow-up events & self-marketing) and documentation purposes. Stickers symbolising your consent will be provided on GEO Day. If you agree that pictures and videos may be taken of you, please place a sticker in a clearly visible place on your clothing.

Recordings of lectures at the online GEO Day

Online lectures will be recorded as part of the online event, during which only speakers are recorded. In this case, the participants will be advised to switch off their camera and the mute function will be activated for all participants.

Competition on GEO Day

As part of the event, there will be a competition in which questions about the stations on GEO Day must be answered. Participants can take part either digitally (via smartphone) or in person. Only pseudonymised data will be collected if a participant is a pupil.

Duration of data storage

We store your data for the purpose of conducting the event and beyond that for the duration of statutory retention periods or as long as legal claims can be asserted against TU Wien or rather as long as consent was given.

Your rights in connection with personal data

As the **data subject** affected by the processing of these data, you have the following rights vis-à-vis TU Wien:

- the right to information;
- the right to rectification;





- the right to erasure;
- the right to restriction of processing of your data;
- the right to data portability;
- the right to object

Right to revocation under Article 7 GDPR

Every data subject has the right to withdraw their consent(s) in writing at any time by sending an e-mail to geotag@geo.tuwien.ac.at. The withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

Right to complain

If you believe that the processing of your data violates data protection law or that your data protection rights have otherwise been violated in any way, you may lodge a complaint with the Austrian data protection authority (<https://www.dsb.gv.at/>).
